6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

This is purely Government Institution run by Government of TamilNadu. Our institution is located in rural area. All our students are coming from socially and economically backward area. Most of our students are first generation learners and so they are going to be first graduate in their family. In order to make them to succeed in their studies, the fee structure is almost free for them. The government is giving scholarship It also gives free bus pass, free lap top, free insurance, free health camps and endowment prizes so that they will not face any monetary burden while they pursue their studies. The foremost mission of the institution is to give value education to the students.

6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

Our institution is purely under the direct control of Government of Tamil Nadu .However the college has internal council members headed by the principal and all heads of the department as members. They often meet to make decisions in all aspects for the welfare of the college and students.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Our Institution is non autonomous and directly under the control of University of Madras. The University conducts regular board of Studies meeting to upgrade and update the syllabus of highest quality in order to pursue higher studies in India and abroad and also to succeed in various State/National Tests

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Proper time-table is prepared as per the UGC norms and followed very strictly. Traditional method of teaching using Chalk and Board is followed. However, Teachers teach the subjects through LCD Projector, Internet and Models. We have language lab where we take our students to do all the internet oriented learning. This is very useful for them to update the subject. To make the learning as a complete one interaction of students is encouraged. Regular class tests, quiz, internal tests are conducted to make the learning as easier and complete one.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Our college is affiliated to University of Madras. University of Madras conducts Semester pattern examination. It evaluates through central valuation and gives results. However under the CBCS internal assessment is done carefully by the staff members by awarding marks as per the university instructions.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Now many of departments in our college are PG departments. We are expecting M.Phil and Ph.D Programmes soon. Many of our staff members are already having guide ship in various universities. At present more than 40 candidates have registered for Ph.D., under our staff members for doing research. Our staff members have got major and Minor projects with various funding agencies such as DST, UGC etc. The financial assistance received from these agencies vary from Rs.1,00,000 to Rs.15,00,000.
